Point soccer opens year with 2 road wins

BECKLEY, W.Va. — Different battles. Same result.

The Point Pleasant boys soccer team started the 2018 season on a solid note following a pair of road wins at Independence and PikeView this past weekend in a pair of non-conference matches at the YMCA Field.

The Black Knights (2-0-0) opened the campaign with a decisive 6-0 triumph over the Patriots on Friday night, then rallied back from a one-goal deficit on Saturday for a thrilling 2-1 decision over the Panthers.

PPHS outshot Independence by a sizable 37-2 overall margin, including a 17-2 edge in shots on goal, as the Red and Black built a 2-0 intermission advantage.

Adam Veroski opened the scoring after receiving a crossing pass from Jaden Reed in the third minute for a 1-0 edge. Veroski added a second goal in the 11th minute following a crossing pass from Cohen Yates.

Point caught a lucky bounce early in the second half as a corner kick bounced off of an IHS player, resulting in an own goal during the 43rd minute.

Isaiah Snyder buried a line drive from 18 yards out into the opposite corner for a 4-0 lead in the 47th minute, then Garrett Hatten planted a loose ball from 12 yards out in the 66th minute for a five-goal cushion.

Snyder completed the six-goal victory in the 69th minute with another successful 18-yard boot to the opposite corner.

Point Pleasant claimed a 3-2 edge in direct kicks and 3-0 advantage in corner kicks. PPHS keeper Nick Smith made two saves for a shutout, while Colton Blackcorn stopped 12 shots in the setback.

The Black Knights were held scoreless in the first half against PikeView, plus Point was unlucky with a bounce over that same stretch.

Gage Damewood found himself in an opportunistic position as the sophomore played a bounce off of a defender in front of the net. The ball took a weird bounce and spun itself inside the post, giving PVHS a 1-0 lead in the eighth minute.

Veroski ended Point's scoreless drought in the 48th minute after booting a 22-yard bullet past the diving attempt of Panther keeper Colton Caskey, tying the game at one.

The eventual clincher came in the 69th minute as Veroski buried a penalty kick into the lower right side of the goal.

The penalty happened when Braxton Watkins-Lovejoy was tripped by multiple defenders while setting up a pass.

The Black Knights outshot PikeView by a slim 15-13 overall margin, which included an 8-5 deficit in shots on goal. Point also claimed a 4-3 edge in corner and was whistled for only six of the 21 fouls in the contest.

Smith stopped seven shots in the triumph, while Caskey made only three saves in goal for the Panthers.

"This was a very good win for us. We haven't had a come-from-behind win for years, and last year we were always on the other side of one-goal games," PPHS coach Chip Wood said following the PikeView victory. "I thought we did a great job of making adjustments in game and it really made a difference in getting some good chances in the second half.

"This was a really good experience for this group in traveling to Beckley. We took care of business in both games, which is a great way to start the season."

Point Pleasant returns to action Saturday when it hosts Independence.

Point Pleasant blanks Patriots, 11-0

POINT PLEASANT, W.Va. — A memorable moment in history.

The Point Pleasant boys soccer program picked up its 350th career victory while also posting its second shutout win over Independence on Saturday in a resounding 11-0 victory at Ohio Valley Bank Track and Field in Mason County.

The Black Knights (3-0-0) were dominant in their 2018 home debut as the Red and Black mustered all 16 shots in the contest while also having seven different players score in the triumph.

PPHS scored the first of its eight first-half goals in the third minute as Alberto Castillo netted a pass from Isaiah Snyder, then Castillo assisted Jaden Reed on a goal in the sixth minute for a quick 2-0 cushion.

Adam Veroski tacked on back-to-back goals in the 11th minute and 14th minute, with Zach Rediger assisting on the latter score for a 4-0 edge.

Braxton Watkins-Lovejoy scored in the 18th minute on a pass from Garrett Hatten, then Luke Pinkerton netted a pair of Castillo passes for goals in the 30th and 32nd minutes — giving the hosts a seven-goal advantage.

Cohen Yates added the final first-half goal after netting a Hatten pass in the 33rd minute.

The game remained at 8-0 until the final 10 minutes of regulation. Connor Fields netted a Nic Matheny pass in the 70th minute for a 9-0 contest.

Veroski posted a hat trick in the 76th minute after planting a pass from Austin Weikle, making it a 10-goal lead. Castillo stole a pass and scored on a long boot in the 78th minute, wrapping up the 11-0 outcome.

Point Pleasant also claimed a season sweep of the Patriots after earning a 6-0 win in Beckley back on Aug. 17.

Nick Smith recorded his second shutout of the year, despite not facing a single shot attempt in the game. PPHS also claimed a 6-0 advantage in corner kicks.

"Everybody played big minutes and we got to move people around a little. The big thing that we demonstrated was a lot of improvement over the game against them last Friday," PPHS coach Chip Wood said afterwards. "They were without their starting keeper and that really hurt them, but we also were putting everything on goal in good spots. We had a lot of unselfish play, which made for a good win."

Point Pleasant traveled to Ohio Valley Christian on Monday and returns to action Wednesday when it hosts Gallia Academy at 7 p.m.

GALLIPOLIS, Ohio. — Another clean sheet for the Black Knights.

The Point Pleasant boys varsity soccer team improved its mark to 4-0 this season following an 8-0 victory over host Ohio Valley Christian on Monday night in a non-conference matchup in Gallia County.

The visiting Black Knights (4-0) scored four goals in the first half en route to the shutout win. The victory serves as the third shutout in four matches for the Red and Black, as well as the second straight contest without allowing a goal.

The game also served as the season opener for OVCS (0-1), playing in its first contest since the 2016 campaign following a season without fielding a program.

Braxton Watkins-Lovejoy recorded the first goal of the contest at the 34:22 mark of the first half en route to a hat trick.

Adam Veroski added two goals, while Garrett Hatten, Alberto Castillo and Isaiah Snyder provided one goal apiece, respectively.

Kaydean Eta and Jayden Reed each provided an assist as Point Pleasant outshot the Defenders by a sizable 35-7 overall margin and also claimed a 6-0 edge in corner kicks.

OVCS goalkeeper Conner Walter finished with five saves in the contest, while PPHS junior Nick Smith saved seven — including a penalty kick opportunity by the Defenders with 7:57 remaining in the first half.

Following the game, PPHS head coach was pleased with his club's performance — but noted the team's low tempo in the first half.

"We came out really lackadaisical in the first half," Wood said. "We didn't play up to our potential. We discussed it at half time with the boys and they came out much better and played with a lot more energy and a greater sense of urgency in the second half. I know we were up 4-0 at halftime, but it just seemed like we were struggling to put anything together.

"We played strong in the second half and were much better. I was proud of them for responding at halftime. Right now our strengths are the central portion of the field. We are able to control things with our forwards and midfielders. I feel like our strength is up the middle and getting forward. Defensively, we have to be way more solid than we were in the first half. I think going forward we have to improve things on the outside and on the wings."

For OVCS head coach Jason Beaver, the setback was a learning opportunity for his young club.

"For as young as this team is they did a really good job despite the score," Beaver said. "Our goalkeeper had a lot to deal with, but I think he did well with what he was faced with. As a whole, our team has a lot of practice to do on containment defense, we have to be able to break down and work on our passing.

"We have to take this and teach on this and use this as a learning tool and not a negative. We need to move on from this experience and focus on our next game."

While the Defenders' return to the soccer pitch for the first time since 2016 was not an ideal outcome for the club, Beaver was happy for his players to be back for the 2018 campaign.

"It's huge for Ohio Valley Christian soccer to be back on the field," Beaver said. "After not having a team, we are excited to be back. We do have a learning curve. We are going to have to overcome that, but I'm very proud of where we stand. We have a group of kids here that have a lot of heart and want to play. I feel like we fight hard for what we have out there. We just have to take it one game at a time."

With the shutout victory, the Black Knights have combined to outscore their opponents 27-1 through four games.

PPHS returns to action on Wednesday when it hosts Gallia Academy, while OVCS next faces Belpre on Thursday at home.

The Black Knights (7-1-0) never trailed in the contest as guests picked up their third consecutive triumph in a rather impressive fashion.

Asaphe Santana scored on a penalty kick for BHS in the 72nd minute, ending the home scoring drought while making it a 7-2 contest.

Veroski gave Point a 1-0 advantage in the 15th minute thanks to an assist by Castillo. Andrew Curtis tied the game at one in the 20th minute on a 20-yard midfield blast that found the back lower left corner.

The Black Knights claimed an 18-11 edge in shots on goal and also posted a 6-2 advantage in corner kicks. Belpre was whistled for a dozen of the 18 fouls in the contest.

Point Pleasant entered the game ranked eighth in the Class AA rankings and 14th overall in the state of West Virginia. The Black Knights have also outscored their opponents by a sizable 41-5 margin and have a pair of double-digit goal scorers already this fall.

A pair of top-10 Class AA teams were scheduled for battle, but the Point Pleasant boys soccer team appeared to be the only group with any ammunition on Thursday night following a 4-0 triumph over visiting Lincoln County in a non-conference match at Ohio Valley Bank Track and Field in Mason County.

The host Black Knights (8-1-0) notched their fourth consecutive victory — tying a season-high mark — while also handing the Panthers (7-1-0) their first setback of the year. It was also the fifth shutout posted by the Red and Black this fall.

PPHS — which entered the contest ranked eighth in the Class AA-A poll — dodged a few bullets throughout the course of regulation, but the hosts also had a few unlucky breaks along the way as well.

Lincoln County — which entered the game ranked sixth in the Class AA-A poll — had a few decent shots sail either wide or high of the net in the opening 15 minutes, while Point Pleasant had little luck in breaking through with a handful of shots ending up on goal.

In the 19th minute, however, the Black Knights cracked the scoreboard as Garrett Hatten found Alberto Castillo open in the mid-front.

Castillo had to make a sliding kick on his shot attempt in front, which cleared two defenders and trickled passed the keeper on the low left side, giving the hosts a 1-0 advantage.

Point Pleasant took that one-goal cushion into the intermission, but the hosts really turned up the intensity in the second half — which showed later in the final score.

Adam Veroski made it a 2-0 contest in the 46th minute as the sophomore had a shot essentially land on his foot while standing in front of the goal. Veroski buried the boot to the low left side to double the home team's advantage.

Veroski netted his second goal of the game in the 59th minute, thanks to an assist from Castillo. Veroski received a pass from 20 yards out and floated a shot top-shelf, which managed to work its way under the cross bar for a 3-0 cushion.

Castillo capped the scoring in the 75th minute after taking a Braxton Watkins-Lovejoy pass and working through two defenders before completing the breakaway goal.

The Black Knights also had a penalty kick goal in the 78th minute, but Garrett Hatten's boot was waived off due to an early start on the offense.

Point Pleasant claimed a 17-10 edge in shots on goal and also had eight corner kicks in the triumph. The Black Knights have also outscored opponents by a 45-5 overall margin this season.

Overall, PPHS coach Chip Wood was pretty happy with the end result ... as well as where his team appears to be at roughly the midway point of the season.

"Honestly, their opportunities came because we were creating so much offense. They dropped a lot of people back into our attack zone and when they could gain possession, it left them a lot of open space on the other side of the field. Lincoln County had some good looks, but Nick (Smith), the back row and the center mids were solid on that end of the field tonight," Wood said. "The good thing on the offensive side was that we made a mid-game adjustment and the kids executed it perfectly. We started the second half sending more crosses in the air to open up that middle. It took about a half-dozen of them, but it really paid off for us in the end. It was a really good win."

Nick Smith recorded his fifth shutout of the year in stopping 10 shots in goal for Point Pleasant.

The Black Knights host Ohio Valley Christian on Saturday, then take a 10-day break in the schedule before resuming play at Chapanville on Sept. 18.

"As of Saturday, we will have played 10 games in 22 days ... so I'm really proud that we can still come out and put in this kind of effort. It really shows that the early season conditioning is working," Wood said. "We need to get through one more game with Ohio Valley Christian, then we have 10 days off on the schedule. We have several things to work on to get better over that time, but it will also give us some time to recover for the stretch run."

Alberto is one of the best exchange students we've ever had to adapt to what we do. It was really nice that our first goal of the game was Hajin to Alberto. To open up our game and have both of the players we were honoring get a stat, that was fun."

DUNBAR, W.Va. — All good things must come to an end.

The Point Pleasant boys soccer team had its magical 2018 campaign come to a screeching halt on Thursday following a 3-1 setback to Williamstown in the Class AA-A Region IV, Section 1 championship match held on Brickstreet Field #1 at the Shawnee Sports Complex in Kanawha County.

The top-seeded Black Knights (17-3-0) were gunning for their first sectional title since the 2011 campaign, but the Yellowjackets (15-6-2) unleashed an offensive onslaught that eventually took its toll by night's end.

WHS produced a sizable 32-10 advantage in total shots, which included a 15-8 edge in shots on goal. More importantly, that differential was noticeable from the start as the guests held leads of 17-5 and 7-3 in those same categories at the intermission.

Still, despite the large discrepancy in offensive attempts, the Red and Black found themselves in good shape at the break as both teams entered halftime scoreless.

The score remained deadlocked at zero for another 10 minutes in the second half, but the Maroon and Gold — and their rapid-fire approach — finally caught up with Point Pleasant in the 51st minute.

Dylan Cosner had a pass land on his foot inside 15 feet of the goal, then split a pair of Point defenders to uncork a shot from the right corner of the goal box. The attempt caromed off of Point keeper Nick Smith's hands and momentum carried the deflection into the back of the net — giving WHS a 1-0 advantage.

Four minutes later, Gavin Bosgraf successfully lofted a left-footed shot from the left corner of the keeper box to the lower right corner of the goal — allowing Williamstown to secure a 2-0 lead in the 55th minute.

The Yellowjackets added the proverbial nail in the coffin in the 70th minute as Boston Caruthers netted a penalty kick into the lower left corner, just beyond the outstretched arms of Smith while giving the guests a three-goal lead.

The Black Knights did, however, get rewarded for their persistence as Braxton Watkins-Lovejoy had a rebound land on his foot, then the sophomore buried a shot into the back of the net on the low left side with 5.4 seconds left in regulation — wrapping up the 3-1 outcome."

Williamstown held a 23-6 shot advantage at the time of its first goal, which included a 10-3 edge on goal.

In discussing the events of the night afterwards, PPHS third-year coach Chip Wood noted that he would have tried some different tactics if the game was to be played again.

But, as he noted, Thursday night in no way took away from what the Black Knights had accomplished this year. In fact, it may only make them better moving forward.

"Williamstown has some good athletes over there and they have a ton of seniors. They have a lot of experience and they play at a high rate of speed, and we've not had to play at that rate of speed all season," Wood said. "I really felt that we could build more of an attack against those guys than we did, but this one is on me because we could have relieved more of the pressure they were putting on us. If we would have cleared and built from the middle of the field instead of working from the back, it may have been totally different for our kids.

"That said, we have pretty much everybody coming back next year and this does add a little extra motivation for these guys. We are looking forward to what we can accomplish next year. At the same time, this season was a terrific surprise for everyone — winning 17 games for the first time since 1994 — and I couldn't be prouder of what these guys accomplished this fall. We know where we need to go with this moving forward, so we still have a lot of work to put in between now and next fall."

Williamstown claimed a 7-4 edge in corner kicks and was also whistled for 11 of the 20 fouls in the contest — including two of the three yellow cards issued in the match.

Smith made a dozen stops in net for the Black Knights, while Baylor Haught stopped six shots in goal for the Yellowjackets. Grant Bobbitt also made one sliding save for WHS on an Adam Veroski shot attempt early in the first half.

The Point Pleasant boys soccer program netted three selections on the 2018 West Virginia Sports Writers Association all-state soccer teams in Class AA-A, as voted on by a panel of media members throughout the Mountaineer State.

The Black Knights ended the fall with a 17-3 overall mark and earned the top seed in the Class AA-A Region 4, Section 1 tournament.

For those efforts, the Red and Black came away with a pair of second team selections and a honorable mention choice.

POINT PLEASANT, W.Va. — It might have been somewhat of a different road, but the Black Knights still managed to reach an ultimate destination.

The Point Pleasant boys soccer team fulfilled a season-long quest to reach the regional finals after knocking off second seeded Sissonville 3-0 Thursday night in the Class AA-A Region IV, Section 1 championship match held at Ohio Valley Bank Track and Field in Mason County.

The top seeded Black Knights (13-3-5) notched the program's first Class AA-A Region IV title game appearance in eight years with their eighth consecutive victory, an outcome that also improved Point's unbeaten streak at home to 9-0-3 this fall.

PPHS picked up its 10th shutout of the season, including the seventh shutout to result in a victory. The hosts also managed to move on by being solid on all three levels of the field.

Point Pleasant outshot the Indians (16-6-1) by a 21-10 overall margin, which included an 11-7 edge in shots on goal.

More impressively, the Black Knights mustered a 12-4 shot advantage in the second half while clinging to a 1-0 halftime lead.

Both teams had a pair of decent chances result in nothing over the first 15 minutes of regulation, but Point's continued aggression eventually produced the game-winning goal in the 22nd minute.

Garrett Hatten received a long pass in stride from 30 yards out, made a touch to slip a defender and found himself in a 1-on-1 opportunity with SHS keeper Trevor Faber. Hatten successful went inside the low near post for a 1-0 advantage with 18:20 left in the opening half.

The Indians were held without a shot attempt for just over 12 minutes in the second half, but that first shot was a point blank attempt that PPHS keeper Nick Smith somehow managed to corral.

It proved to be Sissonville's final best chance to score ... and it led to Point finding some more offense.

Tyson Richards pitched a perfect sideline ball to the mid-goal area, a pass that eventually landed in stride with Adam Veroski. Veroski made a touch to the right and fired a shot to the left side from 12 yards out, allowing the hosts to secure a 2-0 cushion with 15:35 left in regulation.

Point Pleasant provided the proverbial nail in the coffin roughly a minute later as Veroski provided a pass to a streaking Hatten down the right side. Hatten touched right to split a defender and uncorked a shot to the left side from five yards away, making it a 3-goal lead with 14:08 remaining.

Point Pleasant will host the Class AA-A Region IV championship matches — both boys and girls — on Tuesday night. The girls final will start at 5 p.m., while the Black Knights will face the winner of the Winfield-Scott boys match in the night cap.

It is the first Class AA-A Region IV, Section 1 championship for Point Pleasant since 2011, when Chip Wood was nearing the end of his first stint as head coach at PPHS.

Wood returned to guide the program four years ago, and this senior group is the first that Wood has had for four full years.

And, as the venerable mentor noted, that group of upperclassmen is one of the main reasons that the program is sitting where it is right now.

"I'm absolutely thrilled for the seniors. Those guys have put in so much time and effort over four years to get this program to this point, so they all deserve having this trophy come home to us," Wood said. "We handled this game really well today because our defense was dominant, our keeper was solid and our offense was opportunistic.

"I'm really thrilled for the kids to have another opportunity to play in a regional championship game. Being an alum, I'm proud too. We're just looking forward to playing at home on Tuesday night."

Point Pleasant claimed a 7-2 advantage in corner kicks and was also whistled for nine of the 15 fouls in the contest.

Smith made seven saves in goal for PPHS, while Faber stopped eight shots for Sissonville in the setback.

PPHS had high hopes entering the 2019 campaign, but started the season with only five wins in its first 13 matches (5-3-5) — mainly due to an unlucky inability to put goals in the net. In its five ties, Point managed only two goals and recorded three scoreless draws.

The Black Knights have churned out at least two goals in each of their last 10 contests, which has led to a 9-1-0 mark over that span.

Scott and Winfield play Saturday in the Region IV, Section 2 championship.

The Black Knights did not face Winfield this season and dropped a 1-0 decision at Scott back on Sept. 10.

POINT PLEASANT, W.Va. — According to the law of averages, this 13 was unprecedentedly unlucky.

Braxton Vanscoy scored a pair of goals in each half, allowing visiting Winfield to become the first road team to win at Ohio Valley Bank Track and Field this fall while cruising to a 4-0 victory over the Point Pleasant boys soccer team in the Class AA-A Region IV championship match Tuesday night in Mason County.

The host Big Blacks (13-4-5) had their 8-game winning streak come to a halt as the Generals (19-1-4) produced three times as many shot attempts by night's end, including a quartet of goals from Vanscoy — three of which were unassisted.

The Red and Black followed with a missed chance as Adam Veroski sailed a shot from in front high in the 26th minute, easily Point's best shot attempt of the opening 40 minutes.

Winfield answered as Jackson Zulauf hit Vanscoy in stride with a pass in the 32nd minute, and Vanscoy caught the pass in front before firing away from point blank range for a 2-goal cushion just before the break.

Vanscoy's hat trick came in the 46th minute after tracking down a pass 10 yards out, then he made a move to his right before temporarily losing control of the ball.

Vanscoy outran two defenders to the free ball and somehow gathered possession long enough to rip off a shot — which ultimately found the net for a 3-0 advantage.

The final Vanscoy goal came in the 58th minute as he hauled in a goalie deflection and made a touch right, then fired back to the left side from inside 10 yards for a 4-goal lead with just over 20 minutes remaining.

Vanscoy did miss a chance at a fifth goal after firing wide right on a penalty kick with 13:18 left in regulation.

The Generals outshot the hosts on goal by a 9-3 overall margin and also had seven of the nine corner kicks in the contest. The Black Knights were whistled for 11 of the 20 fouls, plus both teams received a yellow card apiece.

Nick Smith made six saves in net for the hosts, while Nathan Lanham secured the shutout for Winfield with three stops.

Wood noted that the better team won on this night and that the setback didn't diminish anything that happened this fall, but the fourth year mentor was still bummed by the final outcome.

He was, however, pleased with the way the community rallied around his troops on Tuesday night.

"It's disappointing in a way because our goal coming into the year was to play 25 games, which would have put us in the state final. It's good that we won the (Region IV) Section 1 plaque and it's good that we are one of the last eight teams playing in our division, but it's frustrating to know that we really never were in this game on the scoreboard. We were in the game on the field, just not on the scoreboard.

"Now, I do want to thank the crowd and community for coming out and supporting these boys. It was a proud moment to see how much support we had out there on the field with us."

It was the final soccer match for seniors Kaydean Eta, Garrett Hatten, Peyton Hughes, Zach Rediger, Nick Smith, Isaiah Snyder and Cohen Yates, as well as exchange student Sondre Folvik.

Wood noted that those eight young men, especially the seniors, are leaving the program in a much better shape than where it was four years ago when they started.

And, as the venerable mentor pointed out, those upperclassmen have been ideal mentors for the other 20-plus members of this program set to return.

"Those seniors are one win shy of 50 for their careers. That's something that has happened only seven or eight times in program history, so these guys have obviously left their mark with some of the best in our school. These guys have played a key role in getting this program back into this spot," Wood said. "They've been good role models for this group and hopefully our younger guys will understand what it takes to get to this level. We'll try and pick up next year where we left off this year."

Point Pleasant finishes the season with a 9-1-3 overall mark at home.

POINT PLEASANT, W.Va. — It's been a while.

The Point Pleasant boys soccer team claimed back-to-back sectional titles for the first time since the 2006-07 campaigns on Saturday afternoon with a 2-0 victory over Sissonville in a Class AA-A Region IV, Section 1 final at Ohio Valley Bank Track and Field in Mason County.

The top-seeded Black Knights (13-4-4) posted their third consecutive postseason shutout while wrapping up the program's eighth sectional championship in school history. PPHS also won titles in 1988, 1989, 1993, 2006, 2007, 2011 and 2019.

Point Pleasant — which won regional titles in 1989 and 1993 — now advances to the Region IV championship on Sunday as it will host Scott at 3 p.m.

The game was originally scheduled for Thursday night, but Boone County ended up in orange on the color-coded map of West Virginia on Saturday evening.

If either team is in the orange or red by 5 p.m. Saturday, the game will be forfeited and the team in the green, yellow or gold county will be declared the winner. If both teams are in the green, yellow or gold, the game will be played on Sunday.

Point Pleasant's defense again dominated the outcome as the hosts held possession for nearly two-thirds of regulation while claiming a 15-2 advantage in shot attempts — including an 8-1 advantage in shots on goal.

The Black Knights broke into the scoring column in the 36th minute as Brooks Gilley received a crossing pass from Colton Young in front of the net. Gilley tracked the pass down from four yards away and buried it in the back of the net for a 1-0 edge.

The score remained that way until the 74th minute as Cael McCutcheon took a free kick pass from lan Wood and chested the ball past the keeper to complete the 2-0 triumph.

It was the ninth shutout this fall for PPHS, which claimed a 5-2 edge in corner kicks. Both teams were whistled for 15 fouls apiece in the contest.

It is the fifth sectional title for current Point Pleasant coach Chip Wood, who also was at the helm of things in 2006, 2007, 2011 and last year.

Black Knights win Region IV title

POINT PLEASANT, W.Va. — Some things are simply worth the wait.

After 27 years since its last appearance at the state tournament, the Point Pleasant boys soccer program is headed back to the promise land following a hard-fought 1-0 victory over Scott in the Class AA-A Region IV championship match on Sunday at Ohio Valley Bank Track and Field in Mason County.

The Black Knights (14-4-4) notched the program's third regional championship since establishing a varsity boys team back in 1986, which eventually led to state appearances previously in 1989 and 1993.

PPHS has never won a game at the state tournament level, but will get another crack at changing things on Friday night when the Red and Black face Charleston Catholic in a Class AA-A semifinal at Carter Field in Beckley. Game time is slated for 7:30 p.m.

Point Pleasant — which served as the guests in this contest due to Scott being the higher overall seed in Region IV — dodged a few bullets in the opening half, but also managed to miss the target on a few opportunities of their own while building up to a climactic scoreless game with 20 minutes left in regulation.

Then, with 16:16 remaining in the second half, the Black Knights made the most of a golden opportunity — and it ended up making all the difference.

PPHS had a corner kick and delivered a pass about 18 yards out in front of the Scott goal. Braxton Watkins-Lovejoy managed to beat the SHS keeper to the ball, but the ball deflected off of another Skyhawk player.

The ball caromed to the left of Watkins-Lovejoy, who then chased after the loose ball and managed to dive forward with his foot and make contact before the Scott keeper could either get to the ball or get back in position to stop the shot attempt.

With Watkins-Lovejoy watching his effort-filled shot from his back, the senior quickly hopped up and celebrated mere moments after the shot hit the net — giving PPHS a 1-0 advantage through roughly 64 minutes of play.

At the time, it was only Point's ninth shot of the game — and fourth on goal. Yet, by night's end, it was the only shot of the night that mattered. The Black Knights ultimately claimed a 12-11 edge in shot attempts, including a 6-4 edge in shots on goal.

It was the 10th shutout recorded by Point Pleasant this season, including its fourth consecutive shutout during this postseason run through the Region IV tournament.

The Skyhawks (13-1-1) — who defeated PPHS by a 4-1 count to open the regular season back on Sept. 2 — were shut out for the first time all year in their only setback of the 2020 campaign.

The rough-and-tumble game featured 28 fouls, including six yellow cards and a pair of red cards. Scott was whistled for 19 fouls, four yellow cards and received both red cards — the last of which came with 1:25 left in regulation.

The Black Knights also took all eight corner kicks attempted in the contest.

Afterwards, fifth-year PPHS coach Chip Wood spoke about the significance of the win — particularly for a program that hasn't appeared at the state tournament since Bill Clinton was in his first term as President of the United States.

"I'm just extremely proud of these young men and the coaching staff for everything that went into making today what it is," Wood said. "We put a plan together and the guys executed everything that we wanted to do today. I have zero complaints about our effort today because this one was just so big for our program.

"I played on this first team that went to state in 1989 and we haven't been back to state since 1993. As the head coach on and off of this program for a dozen seasons, it just seems like we've been chasing this goal forever. After everything we've dealt with this year, it sure feels nice to be back in this spot after all of this time."

Opportunities were at a premium in a scoreless first half as Scott outshot the guests by a 5-3 overall margin, including a 3-1 edge in shots on goal. PPHS also received the only yellow card in the first half.

Things became even more intense after the intermission, with defenseman Nate Smith receiving consecutive yellow cards over a five minute stretch for illegal tackles. Smith's second yellow turned into a red card and left the Skyhawks a man short over the final 25 minutes of regulation.

A small scuffle broke out during a sideline stoppage of play, which resulted in each team picking up its second different yellow card of the game a few moments later.

Then, with 18:02 left in regulation, Scott was called for a foul that resulted in Adam Veroski — Point's all-time leading goal scorer — attempting a penalty kick. Veroski's shot was hauled in by Scott keeper Kadin Clemon, keeping the game tied at all zeroes.

Watkins-Lovejoy followed with the game's only score less than two minutes later, and then it became a game of time management. The Skyhawks produced only one shot on goal in the second half and six shots total after the break, while PPHS managed nine shot attempts after the intermission.

Luke Pinkerton stopped four shots in goal for the Black Knights while earning the shutout win. Clemon made saves on five shot attempts in the setback.

Now the focus turns to having five days to prepare for the Class AA-A state tournament in Beckley. Though the high was pretty high as of Sunday, Wood knows that his troops won't be satisfied with just getting there.

As he noted, there is still plenty of history out there waiting to be made — and the next slice of it could possibly be just 80 minutes away.

"We have to go compete next week with three really good soccer teams. We'll enjoy this for now, but we still have business to take care of," Wood said. "We obviously belong there after a win like this and we want two more games. We've never played in a state final, so Friday really is important to us as another step toward a bigger goal. These guys will be ready to play, no doubt."

BECKLEY, W.Va. — Going all that way, and finishing as close as it gets.

Playing in the state tournament for the first time since 1993, the third-seeded Point Pleasant boys soccer team was tied with second-seeded Charleston Catholic at halftime, at the end of regulation, and at the end of both overtime sessions on Friday night at the Carter Family Foundation Field in Raleigh County. The Irish, however, claimed a 4-2 edge in penalty kicks, securing their spot in Saturday's Class AA-A championship match.

The Black Knights (14-5-4) — which had won eight straight decisions headed into the state semifinal — got on the board first, with a long-range shot from Braxton Watkins-Lovejoy deflecting off the Charleston Catholic (9-1) goal keeper before bouncing into the net 11:57 into play.

Following the match, fifth-year Point Pleasant head coach Chip Wood commended his team's defense, and noted the added pressure once the Black Knights were limited to 10 players.

"Our keeper and our four in front, our four-diamond, they absolutely played outstanding," Coach Wood said. "They played 100 minutes of soccer, and didn't allow a goal in the run of play. (Charleston Catholic) got the free kick, that's how they scored.

"We were under a lot of pressure when we went down to 10 men, and we had to change things up a little bit, we weren't able to play the kind of game we wanted to. They kept pressing us back, and so we started just relieving the pressure, playing a little direct, playing a little boom-ball, and getting the ball out into space."

Watkins-Lovejoy — a senior who also scored Point Pleasant's only goal in the regional final — talked about the feeling of giving his team the lead in the state semifinal, and the ultimate heart-break that followed.

"That first goal was just amazing, knowing we're up, trying to hold them down and get the win 1-0," Watkins-Lovejoy said. "It's just emotional, my last year to lose on PKs, I'm just sad to lose and leave."

Pinkerton — a senior whose 11 saves mark his career-high — admitted that his soccer career was uncertain at times, but playing was undoubtedly the right decision.

"I've had the best time of my life playing with this group," Pinkerton said. "I didn't even know if I was going to play my sophomore year, but I'm glad I came out. And actually, I didn't even know if I was going to play this year, or even start as a matter of fact. This is my first year back being goalie, and I had the best time ever."

Captain of the Black Knights, senior Adam Veroski, reflected on his journey with the Black Knights, from being unsure what role he'd fill on the team as a freshman, to leading PPHS back to the state tournament after a 27-year absence.

"I came in here freshman year, I didn't even know if I was going to get on the field the first day, I was just preparing to be a part of the team," Veroski said. "You know, its been a helluva career. I'm so proud to be a part of this team, everybody on this team growing as a person, becoming a man. I'm proud to be their captain, and I'm proud to be from Point Pleasant."

While the final result wasn't what was hoped for, Coach Wood praised the Black Knights for leaving it all on the field, as well as growing throughout the campaign.

"Our guys absolutely played their hearts out," Coach Wood said. "I'm really super proud of all the guys, they did wonderful. I couldn't be happier with the progress and the things that we did this year, we had a great season."

Black Knight goalie Brecken Louden had six saves, while John Patnoe had three for the Irish.

Point head coach Chip Wood said he's proud of the mettle his team showed.

"It told me they were everything I thought they were," he said. "They were a group of guys that would not quit. They were going to play until the last whistle. I'm proud of them for sticking with it."

Wood also praised the leadership his outgoing group of seniors gave.

"This is the most successful senior class that has ever went through Point soccer," he said. "They've won more games than any other class and it's not even close. The seniors constantly showed leadership, even the ones who weren't named captains. They are an outstanding group of individuals."

The Black Knights end the 2021 season with a 22-2-1 record.

The Point Pleasant boys soccer team fell 4-3 in overtime to the Charleston Catholic Irish in the finals of the WVSSAC Class A-AA Boys Soccer State Tournament Saturday morning.

Down two goals with seven minutes to go, the Black Knights scored two goals to force overtime.

The start of Saturday's game was the definition of 'deadlock', with both teams' defenses doing a good job of containing the opposition.

The first shot on goal occurred 18 minutes in, with Point senior Nick Cichon-Ledderhose kicking a free kick dead center of the Irish goal.

In the last 10 minutes of the first half, Catholic started getting a firmer grasp of the total offense, spending a lot of time on Point Pleasant's half of the field.
